It has been a pleasure to serve the membership the past four and half weeks, I have met many of our wonderful members and spent valuable time participating in various inter-club events and committees.

One message that remained consistent was the need to improve communications between the board, management and membership. We will have a weekly memo that will continue to evolve and serve as an update of operations and events beginning in December. Also, this year the team has developed the 2008 Calendar with all planned golf and social events. This calendar will be available to our membership in January and may be collected in our golf shop or business office.

In order to establish a more regimented link with our membership and community I hope to have members join the clubs marketing ad hoc committee. This group will be assisting me to make critical decisions on the marketing and direction of the member recruitment.

The club has gone through many changes over time, particularly in the past few years. During this time, some of the membership has expressed concern to the changes in a variety of ways. Present and past Board members have spent many hours in meetings with me discussing many of the issues that are causing concerns. I agree with the board that we are not satisfied with the overall experience of the Country Club is providing to the members and that we need to raise the bar in some areas. I am acutely aware of the member concerns and plan to address many of them in a timely fashion.

I also know that many of the member concerns are around the intangible elements of what we believe a country club experience should be. The board and staffs' mission is to deliver the ultimate customer experience at every touch point in the club for our members and guests. A critical step in reaching this vision is retraining our high quality staff commitment to this vision. As the new club manager I am the person responsible for your experience at the club. Please make sure you find me and communicate your expectations.

My personal opinion is that there are accumulative reasons for many of the changes that may not be obvious to many members. Over the last several years, not withstanding budget increases and loss of Equity memberships every year; the boards have imposed a much higher level of financial discipline on the club. This has affected many of the decisions that have been made to the member services. This year and last, the operating cash flow (excluding depreciation) has risen to essentially breakeven after many years of being in the red. We all want to inherit an operation that is at least breakeven (preferably positive) and has a staff and board used to operating with fiscal discipline.

All the Board of Directors are committed to do our best to represent the interests and value of the members and to advise me as I strive to improve your club. If you have concerns, criticisms, or suggestions I would urge you to discuss them with me and/or a board member or fill out one of the "HEY JEAN" Cards on display in all the member areas of the club. We also have some limited time in the monthly board meetings for members to voice their concerns directly to club management and the board. Your best opportunity to have an impact is to join a committee. We will be asking for nominations for 2008. I encourage you to become part of the solution.

The past may contain some controversial and/or unpopular occurrences. The most notable are the closure of the snack bar and departure of Christine who has been serving the membership for many years. I, along with many of the golfing membership, am saddened by her departure. The hard fact is the departures, and most of the other changes, cannot be reversed until the economics justify the services. I would like to urge all members to work towards building the best club we can in anticipation of that day.

The Board of Directors, my family and contributing to this cheer are all the heads of departments, the wait staff who serve you personally, are supported by our chefs and cooks, pantry men, dishwashers and other employees whose unseen work is just as essential. There are housemen, office staff, grounds crew, golf and others – men and women whom we rarely see but who constitute a majority of the staff whose teamwork makes our club run smoothly. We wish all the Village Country Club members a joyful holiday season and a prosperous New Year.

A Little Bit of History—Part II by Jean Sullivan

In 1903 the Union Oil Company purchased a 9,000-acre tract of land originally known as the old Rancho La Purisima.

By the last 1950's, growth and construction at the Vandenberg Air Force Base created a need for off-base housing. Al Bjorkland, or Bjorkland and Smith Development Company, was approached to build housing near the base. He decided it was too big a project for his company to handle alone. He contacted Frank Keller, senior vice president of Utah Construction and Mining Company. Together they visited the area and base officials and ultimately met with Fred Anderson, a property manager for Union Oil Company.

After considerable study, the decision was made to construct a "Village." The Utah Construction and Mining Company established the Vandenberg Village Development Company and made arrangements to purchase land from the Union Oil Company as needed.

Theodore Robinson, noted land planner and golf course architect of Rolling Hills, CA, was hired to prepare the layout. Penfield and Smith did the engineering work, and Cox Brothers were contracted to do the utilities, streets, and sidewalks.

Initial construction was started on the south side of the Lompoc-Casmalia (a two-lane road at that time).

Two men played a major role in bringing Village Country Club to this area: Arthur Stewart, vice president of Union Oil Company and a member of San Gabriel Country Club, AND Edwin Littlefield, president of Utah Construction. Both were avid golfers.

As new housing expanded, the decision was made to build a golf course. Theodore Robinson designed and supervised the construction of the Village Country Club golf course. His design called for the first tee to be where the 10th tee is currently located. The clubhouse plans prepared in the San Francisco office put the pro shop in its present location, hence the shift of nines. Price of the clubhouse was \$350,000.

The board of directors of Utah Construction did not want to fully pay for the golf course construction and therefore formed Adobe Canyon Corporation with Union Oil Company. Utah held 51% of the stock and Union Oil 49%. When the course was completed, it was leased to the Vandenberg Development Company to operate.

On July 19, 1962, the course was officially opened. A dedication ceremony was held with several officers of the Utah Mining and Construction flying down from San Francisco, and officers from Union Oil coming in from Los Angeles. Dignitaries from Vandenberg Air Force Base and Lompoc also attended. A golf tournament was held, with Tom Harmon, the famous All-American football player, winning. Clinton Arrey was the first golf pro.

It wasn't until August 1st, 1963, that the first set of by-laws for the Club was approved by the Board of Directors of the Village Country Club's Men's Association headed by Donald Messick. Also, a women's board was formed during this time.
