Water Quality Management

- ❖ Time watering to minimize evaporation
- ❖ Use drought resistant grasses
- ❖ Maintain shoreline buffers to filter runoff
- ❖ Establish no-spray zones near water
- ❖ Detect and repair leaks quickly
- ❖ Regularly test water
- ❖ Control erosion
- ❖ Have automated irrigation system to control water quantities used

Integrated Pest Management

- ❖ Early damage evaluation
- ❖ Pest identification
- ❖ Use of biological controls when applicable
- ❖ Timely and conservative use of pesticide levels
- ❖ Use of pest resistant grasses and trees
- ❖ Proper cultural controls, aerification, mowing practices and thatch control
- ❖ Employee education
